president of Religions for Peace International in South Africa.

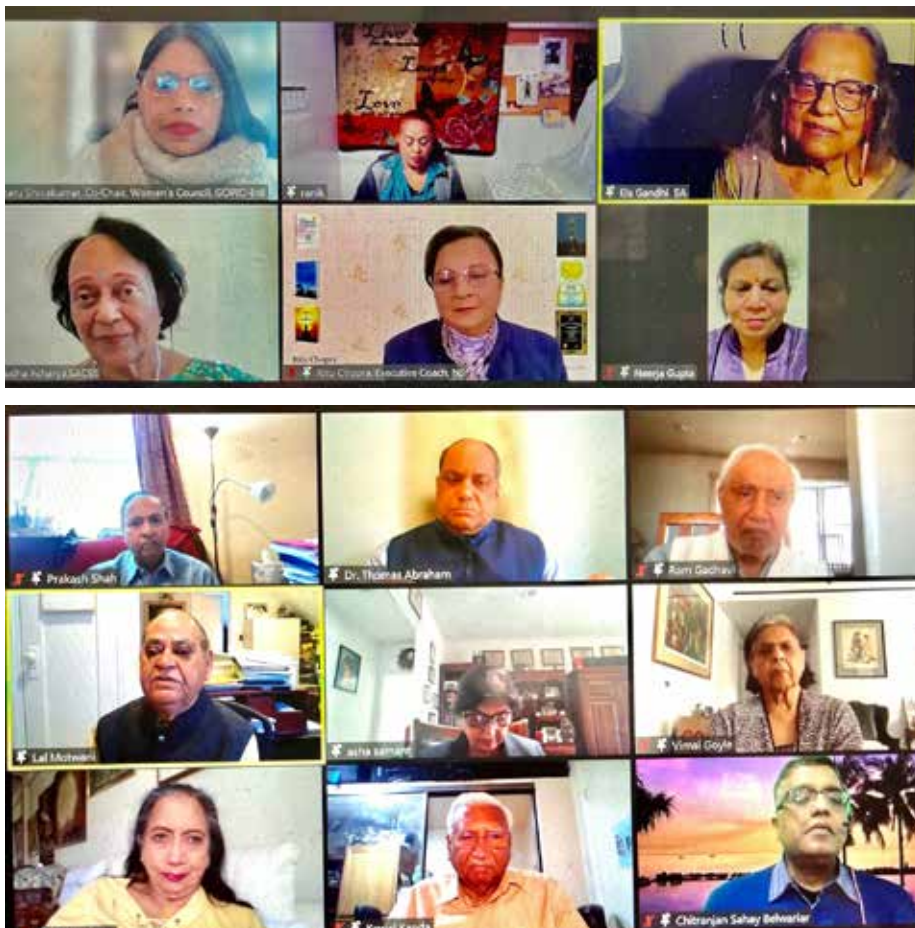
Smt. Dr Neerja Arun Gupta – Vice Chancellor of Gujarat University and Chair of GOPIO Academic Council, Ahmedabad, India

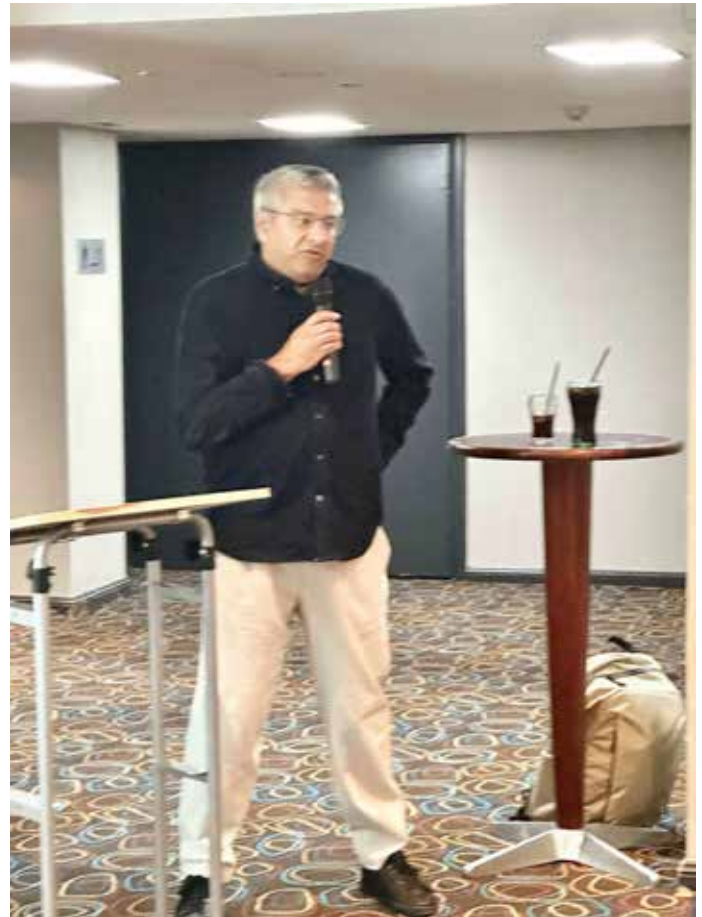

The Australian tour included mesmerising performances in Adelaide, Melbourne, Sydney and Gold Coast.

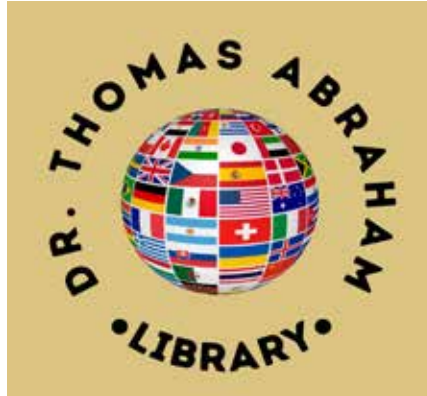
The audience was mesmerised by the performance by Vinay Desai, whom Jay Dabgar ably accompanied on the tabla.

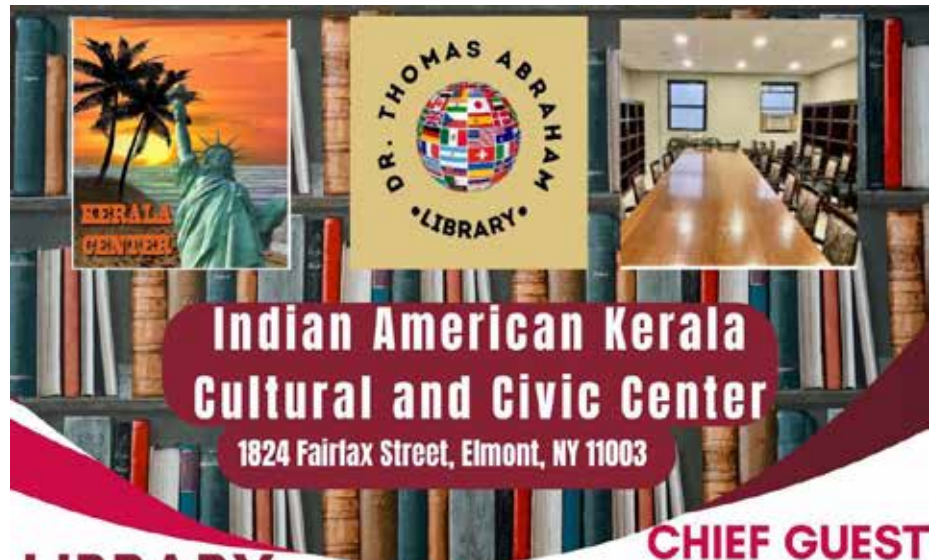

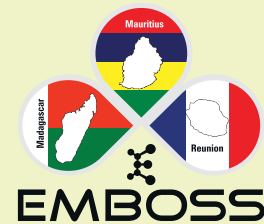
